Connecting Financial Stewardship With Practical Money Skills

Organization Overview

Macomb Community College hosted a financial education session focused on the intersection of **financial stewardship and personal financial responsibility**.

The program brought together community members interested in strengthening their understanding of money management through both practical financial strategies and values-based perspectives.

Program Delivered

Biddles Group delivered a **90-minute interactive workshop** focused on:

- budgeting and financial discipline
- saving and long-term planning
- managing debt responsibly
- understanding investing basics
- aligning financial decisions with personal values

The session included **breakout discussions**, allowing participants to reflect on financial habits and share ideas with peers.

Audience

Approximately **40–60 attendees**
