

Nonviolent Jesus

Lately, it seems there is a violent shooting or bombing of innocent people every day. Mass shootings, school shootings, assassinations of well-known leaders. Around the world, there are missile attacks, drone attacks, armed invasions and encroachments. The response to this violence is ... more violence.

There is a different way to live. I have been listening to episodes the "Nonviolent Jesus Podcast" with Father John Dear. Father John has spent his life protesting against violence in its many expressions in the world. He has taken a stand against nuclear bombs, against war, against all conditions which oppress people. He points out, for example, that building weapons requires people to work daily in unsafe conditions, to live near polluted land and air, to raise children in conditions which will affect them all their lives.

Father John's work is based on scripture, especially the Beatitudes. Here is a quote from a sermon on the sixth Beatitude: Love your enemies.

We can never talk about this commandment enough. For me, it sums up Christianity. If we do this, we will obey Jesus fully, because it encompasses everything—reflecting God's universal love, working for disarmament, seeking justice for the poor, practicing forgiveness, living in hope and trusting in the God of peace. ... What's so shocking is that Jesus commands us to love our enemies not just because it's right; not just because it's moral; and not because it's the only practical solution; but because God

loves God's enemies. This is the nature of God. Jesus wants us to be "sons and daughters of your God in heaven, for God makes God's sun rise on the bad and on the good, and causes rain to fall on the just and on the unjust." *

Loving our enemies applies in many ways: in the voting booth, in donating to food pantries, in paying school taxes. It even applies when we are driving and shopping.

I hope that the next time we hear of a violent action, we can take a breath and count the many ways God loves the person who caused the violence, as well as the person or persons who were injured.

Zoom Bible Study

In 325 CE, a group of bishops from around the Christian world gathered in Nicaea, Bithynia. They were charged with defining who Jesus of Nazareth was. Theories and theologies abounded: was he human, was he divine, was he a combination of human and divine? How? And what did it mean for believers?

On October 20, we will begin to study the Nicene Creed, and why it says what it says. This study will last approximately 10 weeks, as we begin with some background material before diving into the study book.

We will use the book Worshiped and Glorified: A Study of the Nicene Creed, by Timothy J. Winterstein. You may choose to purchase the book from the usual sources in paper or electronic form.

The plan is to capture helpful information on finances for calling a new Pastor and celebrating the generosity of our congregation. These four weeks will be a time of reflection for each of us to prayerfully consider what our investment of time, energy and resources are at Gloria Dei and do we meet our own expectations of what is important to us and what matters.

Nourish to Flourish

This summer, Ruth Circle embraced a special project to support the students and families of Leesburg Elementary School. Working with Florence, the school's Family Liaison, we collected and delivered much-needed snack items.

Through these conversations, we learned that the need is even greater than we imagined. Food insecurity among families in our community has risen sharply, with as many as 87%—approximately 600 families—uncertain of where their next meal will come from. Florence shared that food is distributed to families as quickly as it arrives. The school now has a refrigerator, freezer, and pantry to provide nourishment. Children receive meals and snacks during the school day, and on Fridays, they are sent home with food to last the weekend—because for some, those meals are the only food they will have until school resumes.

The need has shifted from snacks to more substantial food items. In response, Gloria Dei Church is launching an ongoing ministry: Nourish to Flourish. This program will provide long-term support to Leesburg Elementary by collecting and distributing essential food items for children and families in crisis.

The Church Council has joyfully approved this ministry and encourages us to give generously, keeping in mind both our unhoused neighbors and working families who struggle to make ends meet. A collection box will be available in the narthex for donations of the following items:

- Canned fish and canned meats
- Small boxes of cereal
- Granola bars
- Juice (individual or gallon) and bottled water
- Rice and macaroni & packages)
- Fruit cups

- Soup
- Peanut butter and jelly
- Instant oatmeal

Every contribution makes a difference. As Florence reminded us, even one can of tuna or one bag of groceries can change a child's day.

If you prefer to give financially, Gloria Dei has a dedicated fund for Leesburg Elementary. Your donations will be used directly to purchase food. Checks may be made payable to Gloria Dei, with "Leesburg Elementary" noted in the memo line.

Together, we can ensure that no child goes hungry. Thank you for helping us live out our mission to share God's love in tangible and life-giving ways.

THE BELIEVE THE BEST PRINCIPLES

The Basics:

Every relationship has spoken and unspoken expectations. And then there are the actual experiences within the relationship. Sometimes the expectations and experiences match up, and sometimes they don't. When they don't it creates a gap:



EXPECTATION

EXPERIENCE

gap

When a gap occurs between what we expect and what we experience, we can choose to fill the gap with one of two things:

BELIEVING THE BEST or ASSUMING THE WORST

Believing the Best is based on trust and goodwill Assuming the Worst is based on distrust and suspicion.

Five Principles for being a "Believe the Best" community:

- 1. When there is a gap that forms between what I expect and what I experience, I will BELIEVE the best. (We will start with trust and goodwill).
- 2. When other people assume the worst about you, I will come to your DEFENSE.

(Gossip is not permitted; we will put the best construction on what our neighbor does-

the Eighth Commandment).

3. If what I experience begins to erode my TRUST, I will come directly to you about it.

(We won't let issues fester or be shared with others, nor will we ignore them).

4. When I'm convinced I will not be able to deliver on a promise, I will inform you AHEAD of time.

(We will keep our commitments to one another).

5. When you confront me about the gaps I've created, I will tell you the TRUTH.

(We will be open to hearing others' concerns, and respond to them with integrity).
